Please join us for our upcoming artist presentation by Jonna Lee . Ms. Lee's artwork encompasses public art sculpture which 'engages process, material, and form.' She is based in Los Angeles and will share with us not only her own work, but how the LA based arts community is recovering from the LA and Altadena fires in January. Ms. Lee lost both her studio and her home in these fires.

Examples of her work are shown here. Her work challenges 'the viewers' assumptions about particular materials, and the visceral impact present when any given artwork seduces the human senses. Sensory qualities of touch, feel, scent, sound, and empathy with kinetic movement have been deployed in Lee's sculpture. ... where she weds seamlessly ... her inventive usage (of form) and material sensitivity.'

Jonna Lee earned a BFA from Otis College of Art & Design and an MFA from Claremont Graduate University.

Artist of the Month: Lauren Whitlock



ARTIST BIOGRAPHY

LAUREN WHITLOCK

Lauren Whitlock is a watercolor artist whose vibrant compositions capture the beauty of nature, architecture, and travel. Based in Riverside, California, she transforms her experiences into evocative paintings that invite viewers into her world.

Her love for art began in childhood, sketching her five sisters on the church bulletin during service. Recognizing Lauren's talent, her mother found a local watercolor artist who offered lessons. Lauren began lessons at age ten and continued through eighteen. What began as a love for drawing soon evolved into a deep appreciation for painting. She was immediately captivated by watercolor's fluidity and expressive potential, setting the stage for a lifelong passion.

Recognized early for her talent, she earned multiple awards at the Riverside County High School Art Show (Best Watercolor (2002), Second Place Overall (2003) and Third Place Overall (2004)). Lauren continued her art education by taking several art and art history courses in college. She earned an Associate of Arts degree from Riverside Community College (2006) and later a Bachelor of



Arts in Liberal Studies from California State University, Fullerton (2009).

Over the years, Lauren's work has been recognized with numerous awards and featured in exhibitions across Southern California. A few awards include the Committee Excellence Award at the Corona Arts Colony (2012), Second Place at the Corona Art Association (2012), and First Place Watercolor at the Arts Colony (2021). Her work has been showcased in various exhibitions, including the Riverside Art Museum, the museum's Art Market (2022, 2023), UC Riverside Botanical Garden's 'Art in the Garden' (2018-2024), and the Irvine Fine Arts Center Holiday Faire (2024).

Lauren remains enthusiastic about sharing her artistic journey and inspiring others. When she isn't painting or traveling, she cherishes time spent baking with her daughter and gardening.

Elizabeth Anne Oren Reade

May 25, 1952 - February 26, 2025 Wife, Mother, Sister, Aunt

Elizabeth Reade was a Navy-baby, born in Kodiak, Alaska in 1952, and later became the oldest of six siblings. She graduated from Ramona High School in 1970, where she loved being on the drill team and in choir, and being picked as Miss Junior Achievement of Riverside. That summer, Beth met Mike Reade, and after attending RCC for a time, they moved to the beach where she worked at the Bank of Newport. In 1977, they were married under the Cross on the top of Mount Rubidoux on New Year's Day.

After moving to Hemet, Beth realized her greatest dream of becoming a mother, and her loving dedication and involvement in Megan and Whitney's childhoods gave her a lifetime of joy. Her other interests included tennis, golf, and going skiing - and especially heading the Assistance League's Elementary School Educational Puppeteering Program. She loved her Bunco girlfriends, being at the beach in August, and planning summertime multi-week RV trips with the family – across the USA, to every Western US & Canada National Park, and to every Mission in California.

Back in Riverside, Beth worked for LiveNation at the Performing Arts Center, joined and volunteered at the Riverside Art Museum, and became a Master Gardener through the UCR Program. She loved cruising (especially to Alaska) and taking car trips - but more than anything she loved to dance with Mike anywhere and any time (especially at Lake Alice, the Mission Inn, and in the kitchen). Her other favorite pastimes were being with her Bridge group friends, her neighborhood Bunco friends, her sisters, and her best friends.

Beth put up a valiant fight against lewy-body dementia for over a year, finally succumbing to pneumonia caused by her asthma, and on a beautiful Wednesday evening at 6:00, she passed away peacefully with her daughters and husband at her side. Like her, it was a blessing.
